For most Americans, it is hard to imagine life during wartime as experienced in other places around the world. Not counting the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001—no city on the American mainland has experienced being shelled since the Civil War.

Until last year, it was no different in Ukraine. The brutality of World War II left enormous scars in the memories of the elderly, but those born after 1945 had no memory of what it was like to have their cities under fire. But all that changed when the battles in the east began, shattering thousands of lives. Yet the evangelical churches SGA serves are proclaiming the peace and love of Christ before their people every day. Your prayers and faithful support are having an eternal impact.

Yevgeny Taran labors in Ukraine's Kherson region on the coast of the Black Sea near Crimea. Shortly after the crisis began raging in 2014, he had been helping three refugee families from the Donetsk

and Lugansk regions. Over time, this number grew to 45 families in 11 villages, including families with children and those with physical challenges. He reports that the conflict has led to numerous ministry opportunities.

Because of where we are located, we have seen a lot of military equipment and many soldiers. We also have many refugees from Crimea and the eastern regions, and we've been collecting humanitarian aid for them. Earlier, we helped families relocate to safer regions. Then later in the summer, we had a youth conference

Greetings from my far away city in Central Asia! I am 16 years old. I went to church for the first time when the mother of my friend took me. I really like it, but it has been difficult. I am my father's favorite and his only daughter. He is not opposed to the fact that I have become a Christian, but my Mom and the rest of my family are opposed. They tease me and call me "Kofir" (unfaithful).



I was saved in 2011. I love to sing and I often take a hymnbook and sing the hymns that talk about God being our Guide, and that Christ died on the cross and rose again for us. That was the very thing that played a huge role in my life. I was saved and my life began to change. I continue to praise God in my native language. I believe the Lord gave me a voice to praise His name. Please pray for my Mom and my family. I really love them and want them to be with me in eternity. Thank you for everything!

It has now been a year and the doctors say in 20 years of practice, they had never seen a person stop dialysis and have his kidneys function again! A Thankful Widow and Faithful Grandmother

Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of our God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world (James 1:27).

SGA-sponsored *Orphans Reborn* teams primarily carry out their dedicated ministries at orphanages and children's homes across Russia and her neighboring countries. But the Lord often brings other wonderful ministry opportunities their way beyond the walls of the orphanage.

Such is the case in a Central Asian nation where SGA-sponsored missionary pastors and children's workers must labor discreetly due to opposition. Our *Orphans Reborn* team wrote to tell us the story of Tatiana, an 86-year-old widowed grandmother who faces many challenges,

yet with a deeply thankful heart for what God has done for her through SGA partners . . .

Tatiana's husband passed away a long time ago. She lives in a small village outside a larger city nearby. She was in bed for eight months with a spinal deformity, and for the past six months has been walking with crutches. She is raising her 14-year-old grandson, Vitya. Tatiana

is amazing! She walks on crutches, lights the stove, cooks and sings songs! When I went to visit her not long ago, I found her singing! Yet Tatiana has a hard life. Her children are gone. Her youngest son (Vitya's father) lost his life in an accident when Vitya was very small. After the funeral, Vitya's mother started drinking and left, taking Vitya's younger sister away with her. They have not heard from her since. Tatiana's two younger sons also fell into tragedy. One of them left to study at a naval academy in St. Petersburg and got involved with bad company. After a few years, his younger brother went to visit him and ended up killing his own brother in a drunken brawl. He was sent to prison and Tatiana has not seen him since—it is said that he died in prison.

Despite such sorrow, Tatiana is such a very kind and humble woman! She expects nothing from others, yet we gave her food and a copy of God's Word. When we parted, she said, "God sent you to me and I feel better now." We invited Vitya to our winter camp that we held over the holidays, but he was not able to come as there is no one to help his grandmother—they have to haul firewood and coal from the street and Tatiana is not able. Please pray for her salvation (and Vitya's) as they read and study God's Word.

CIS in the News



A recent report by Forum 18 said that religious groups or communities in Russia holding meetings or other activities in public without Russian state permission may find their members facing five-figure rouble fines if they do not inform local authorities in advance. However, the issue is being challenged in the court system. One case involves a Sochi evangelical pastor who was fined for holding prayers and Bible study in a rented café. In addition, a Baptist preacher in Smolensk plans to appeal a conviction for handing out religious literature in a public

park. Another Baptist in Orel was fined for organizing an outdoor hymn sing in a children's playground.

In the Sochi case, the prosecution used a provision in the Criminal Code requiring notification of authorities in advance of religious meetings. Alexander Verkhovsky of the human rights organization SOVA Center said he thinks authorities may in the end use this Code provision to target political activists instead of religious groups. The report notes that Russia's Constitutional Court struck down this provision of the Criminal Code, but the legal wrangling is not over. This situation is a matter for much prayer, as the potential impact on evangelical churches is significant. Please join SGA in lifting this matter before the Lord.

In June, we were invited to hold a children's camp in the local public school. It was an especially blessed ministry because we were able to clearly share the Gospel. 141 children had a chance to hear the truth about God. It also was a wonderful way to reach parents with the Word of God.

This camp and where we held it was a great miracle of the Lord. *In previous years, we held camps in our church. But every time, the authorities came, forbidding our camp and fining our church for holding camp.*

In 2013, 11 representatives from the county and different departments came to our camp.

We were threatened, saying that for such religious activities, the person, responsible for the camp may go to jail. Thank God, it didn't happen. We were only fined. But this year, the Lord granted a miracle. The school principal, who had been against our camps and had been the initiator of the different previous inspections, invited us to hold the Christian camp in the school. So many children attended that we held our meetings in the gym instead of in the classroom. After camp, we agreed that with the beginning of the school year, we would hold Good News meetings in our church once a month." (Drobot, Jan. 26, 2015)
