Michael A. Johnson Returns to SGA as President

Recently, Dr. Bob Provost sent a letter to SGA partners announcing his decision to retire after nearly 23 years as our mission's president. In his letter, Bob echoed the similar words of SGA founder Peter Deyneka Sr. when he decided to retire in 1975. While celebrating God's hand of blessing on SGA and our many fruitful ministries during his tenure, Peter said that it was time to transition leadership to someone with the strength and endurance of a younger man. He also noted that his successor, Peter Deyneka Jr., was already familiar to SGA partners.



And here in 2017, God has amazingly arranged similar circumstances as our board of directors has unanimously chosen Michael Johnson to succeed Bob as president of SGA effective May 1. Michael has a long history with our mission, having served as our vice president of advancement from 1996-2004. Board chairman Warner Tillman reflected on

how God's hand has guided this entire process . . .

For Michael and SGA, this is truly coming full circle for the glory of Christ. During a visit Bob Provost had made to a supporting church in New York City 21 years ago, he encountered Michael at an Adult Bible Fellowship Michael was teaching. Michael was then a young Madison Avenue advertising executive with a passion for teaching God's Word. Not long afterward, Bob invited Michael and his wife, Erin, to serve Christ at SGA.

During those years, Bob mentored Michael, and Michael helped develop SGA's Orphans Reborn and Immanuel's Child ministries, and





assisted in the growth of our training and church-planting ministries. In 2004, Michael stepped back into the business world to help put his sons through college. He has served for the past several years as senior vice president of the highly respected firm, Douglas Shaw and Associates in Naperville, Illinois. Through these experiences, the Lord has been equipping and preparing Michael to return to SGA for such a time and place as this.

In passing the torch to Michael, Bob Provost reflected with thanksgiving on what God has done through the gifts and prayerful support of our partners during his tenure . . .

Through you and other faithful partners over these past nearly 23 years, the progress of the Gospel across the Russian-speaking lands has been far more abundantly beyond all that we could have asked or thought.

And more than 90 percent of all the communities are still waiting for their first Bible-preaching church, especially in Russia's Far East. The work that remains to be done is staggering, yet we trust that God will guide and provide in the exciting days ahead.

Michael desires to build on the solid biblical and ministry foundation laid by Peter Deyneka and Bob Provost, who will continue to serve as an advisor to Michael and is being honored by the board with the title of President Emeritus. Reaching the Orphans of Russia's Far East

The Overwhelming Need for SGA's Orphans Reborn Ministry

Life in Far East Russia can be challenging at best. The winters are bitter cold, with temperatures exceeding 50 below zero Fahrenheit. Living in this harsh region of Russia takes its toll on families, where the divorce rate is double that of the United States. This region is among the highest for alcohol abuse, which impacts many families. .

Such living causes children to suffer the most from neglect and abuse. Many in this region are housed in 334 state-run orphanages. Nearly 70 percent of these children have a living parent or guardian. With broken hearts, these children suffer daily with growing hopelessness, as they look for their parents to come and take them home—and the parents never come. I have visited orphanages where the children crowded around me just for a chance to hold my hand, get a hug, or sit on my lap and ask me to take them home with me. For these dear ones in the Far East, hope is even harder to find.

As many of you know, through SGA's *Orphans Reborn* ministry, we have been serving amazing Bible-teaching local churches as they reach out to orphans with the Gospel. We often hear of orphans coming to faith and being totally

transformed by God's grace. We know of orphans who have been saved, and after leaving the orphanage upon reaching young adulthood, have continued on as part of *Orphans Reborn* teams themselves. They love to reach younger orphans for Christ just as they were reached.

In the Jewish Autonomous Oblast, a local church supported through the *Orphans Reborn* ministry lovingly visited such children. Then suddenly, the door to the orphanage tragically closed. At that time, this was the only ministry to orphans in Russia's Far East that had requested support. However, under SGA's new *Reach Russia Now* initiative, this is already changing dramatically! Plans are being implemented to visit ten orphanages.

So much more can be done to love the fatherless in the Far East of Russia, and to comfort their broken hearts. Today there are churches in four key regions of the Far East ready to establish ministries at 10 orphanages. Please join us in praying for sponsors for this. Please join with us so that more churches can be planted and more orphan children can be reached with the Gospel through *Orphans Reborn*. These children are crying out for hope, a hope that only our Lord can provide.

God's Power on Display in the Courtroom

So, having obtained help from God, I stand to this day testifying to both small and great . . . (Acts 26:22).

Faithful evangelical believers across Russia and her neighboring countries encounter many different types of opposition. But God has the power to take the opposition of men and turn it into opportunity, as He vividly did in the life of a young man named Yevgeny. Missionary pastor Victor Bogushevich recently shared this wonderful testimony in a report to his SGA sponsors . . .

Alexander and Karina are a missionary couple sent out by our church. Alexander teaches school and is active in youth ministry. There are people in his village who are very negative

about the teaching of God's Word. One day, unknown people set Alexander's car on fire, destroying the vehicle completely. Alexander went to the police to report it, but the authorities were indifferent. They took the report, but said that there would not be any way to find who had burned the car. In other words, they made it clear that

they weren't going to do anything about it. Alexander kept visiting the station and pressing for investigation, but the local police just laughed and told him not to come back—they were tired of him.

Alexander quietly replied, "All authorities are established by God, and if you do not want to seek the person who committed this crime, I am going to ask for help from the Most High Authority—Jesus Christ Himself. And if He wills, the person who did this will come to the police station and confess his crime!" The police burst into laughter again, and Alexander left.

About a month later, a young man named Yevgeny walked into the police station and wanted to make a confession. He was the one who had set Alexander's car on fire. When the astonished police asked Yevgeny why he decided to confess his crime, he replied that he couldn't understand what was going on with himself. He could not sleep at night, and even during the day did not feel at rest. All he could think about was the burning car and the nagging thought—"Go to the police and admit your crime!" During the trial, Alexander told the court that he forgave Yevgeny and did not want any reimbursement for the car. That same night, Yevgeny

came to Alexander's home and asked why he had been forgiven, providing Alexander with a God-given opportunity. "Christ has forgiven me

much more and He commanded me to forgive you!" On that same evening, Yevgeny repented and trusted in Christ as his Lord and Savior!

In September of 2016, Yevgeny was baptized and shares his testimony as God provides opportunities. Please pray for him, as well as for Alexander, Karina, and Victor, as they shine the light of the Gospel in a very dark corner of Siberia.

God's Provision for Needy Children in Central Asia



Through Compassion Ministry and other resources provided through SGA partners, evangelical churches are reaching out to needy families in Central Asia where poverty is rampant. Recently, school supplies were provided for children in families where the parents are hearing-impaired, and the Gospel was shared. Our missionary pastors held Bible lessons and other activities with the children. Not many of the families can afford to buy school supplies, and they were very happy to receive the gifts . . .

Valeria is only 10, and on first sight she seems to be a normal child in this orphanage. She was admitted four years ago from another orphanage that the authorities closed down due to some criminal issues. Valeria had been abused, which probably contributed to her behavior being so unruly—to the point that all the teachers could do was leave her alone.

The first year she was at our orphanage, Valeria did not come to our lessons very often. When she did come, she would sit quietly in a corner, with her arms closed, and sway from side to side. It was a very sad picture and I began to pray for her.

Over the last academic year, she became the best student in our class. Valeria recently gave me a very pleasant surprise. At the end of the lesson, I asked the children to tell me which of them reads their Bible on a regular basis, and not only for completing homework, but in their leisure time. Very few raised their hands. But when the lesson was over, Valeria came to me and said that she had something important to tell me.

Quietly, she began to speak. *"I try to read the Bible very often because I need to know the way I need to live. Since I invited Christ into my heart, I need to know more of how to please Him and not to sadden Him with my sins. He healed me. I had a nervous breakdown and I asked Him to heal me, and He helped, and now I am healed."* Amazed, I asked her when all of this had happened, and who helped her to come to Christ? She looked at me somewhat puzzled, and replied, *"I was just reading the Bible and it became clear to me. I realized what I needed to do. Do I need someone's help to turn to God?"*

Of course, the answer to her question was no, but how wonderful to hear that a child was able to come to the point of understanding such a serious decision. God really can do anything without external help! He can accomplish His work in the hearts of sinners, and it does not matter the age.

Friends, I beg you to pray for Valeria, asking that God will strengthen her faith and keep the fire burning in her heart, as well as grant her continuous assurance in Christ. Today I can see the changes in her life, and the teacher also witnesses about it. This brings joy to our hearts, and gives us understanding that our labor in Christ is not in vain!

CIS in the News

Tensions Remain High in Ukraine

Recently there have been several outbreaks of renewed violence related to the war with Russian separatists in eastern Ukraine. In addition to the fighting—which has claimed more than 10,000 lives—news media have reported that an “informal blockade” of needed goods flowing out of separatist-controlled regions had begun. The blockade seemed mostly focused on coal destined for power plants, which greatly concerns the Kiev central government. Meanwhile, another cease-fire agreement that had been reached in February failed to stop the fighting.

The ongoing loss of life and societal upheaval caused by this conflict grieves our brothers

and sisters in evangelical Ukrainian churches. SGA continues to help as much as possible through our Crisis Evangelism Fund, which supplies funds for food, clothing, shelter, heating coal, and other aid for refugees. Please



join us in praying for the peace to hold, for settlement of the conflict, and for the ongoing resources needed to help the churches minister to the victims.
