2 As SGA begins our new fiscal year, pray for faithfulness and wise stewardship throughout as our leadership team and board continue to make important financial decisions.

3 Pray for SGA president Michael Johnson, our leadership team, and board of directors today. These are challenging days around the world, and we need the Lord's wisdom in planning for ministry in the coming months.
