We salute you, our dear friends. Thank you very much for your support and prayers. We continue to serve God as missionaries in the Republic of Georgia. We are carrying out rehabilitation ministry and have been bringing God's Word to those addicted to drugs, alcohol, and gambling, as well as ministry to the homeless for almost two years.

From the very beginning of our arrival in Georgia in 2019 until September 2021, we have ministered to people at the Rehab Center in a small town of our region. We helped an already functioning Rehab Center with our expertise—our whole family has lived in the Rehab Center. We have worked with people through local churches. A lot of people have received treatment in the Rehab Center. Everywhere and always, we have seen God's hand helping us and leading us. During this time we had a daughter and we have made many friends. We have gained an invaluable experience in learning the culture and thinking of the Georgian people.

Today we are seeing much fruit of this hard work—more and more people are learning about God and about the help we provide free of charge for addicts. During this time, we have helped many people get legal documents, find apartments, and helped others find jobs.

From Addiction to Ministry

Some of the men who have gone through rehabilitation are **already enrolled in the Bible college.** We keep in touch with people even after their stay in the Rehab Center. We are very happy about this, and God gives us the strength and desire to continue to serve Him here, especially since there is a great need and we have the support of the locals. We are not willing to stand still, and we believe we

need to move forward and advance the ministry. There are not more than five Christian rehabilitation centers in Georgia, and the population is almost four million people.

Our team has the goal of building our own rehabilitation center near the city of Tbilisi, the capital of Georgia. At the current stage, we are looking for a plot of land to buy to build our new rehabilitation center there. Once a week we help in another ministry—feeding homeless people and teaching the Bible to them.

My wife and I are very grateful to the Lord God for His priceless gift, and for the people He encourages to be concerned about our common cause. We have dedicated our lives to serving Him. Please pray for the advance of this ministry and for God always to give us wisdom. We also have a need to move closer to the capital of Tbilisi to lead the ministry and communicate effectively with people there. But renting an apartment there is a little more expensive and we do not have enough money to live there. Please also pray that the Lord will provide finances for this as well. May the Lord bless you! •

If there is one thing that I can say after many visits to the former Soviet Union, it is this. Believers there truly live the faith that they profess. Because of seven decades of atheistic communist rule that oppressed the church and the suffering that endured, their faith is precious to them like fine gold. In the overwhelming spiritual darkness that surrounds them, the light cast by believers is quite noticeable. Their joy and their peace are unmistakable against a dark background. A single candle in darkness casts a profound light. Therefore, when people distant from God encounter believers living out their faith, they are drawn towards that same faith. And we saw this during a summer camp in Ukraine.

One family that had suffered greatly was overwhelmed by what they saw this past summer, first with aid through SGA-supported **Compassion Ministry** and then through a **Summer Bible Camp.** One young mother wrote,

"My name is Lera and I have **three daughters**. Due to the situation in the country, my husband lost his job, and we have a very difficult situation in the

family. Fortunately, we got acquainted with some people who were Christians and we could see that people may live as one happy family and help each other. One day they came to us and offered food packages. They told us about a God who loves all people and loves us, too, and they invited our girls to the Christian camp. Every evening, the girls would come back home in a joyful, cheerful mood, and told us with enthusiasm about everything they saw, heard, and experienced in the camp. The girls would go to other camps, but they liked the Christian camp the most. They said that it was so interesting and fun, and different than other camps they attended. And now they are waiting for the Sunday school to begin. Thank you all very much!"

Through the faithful ministry and witness of the local church, Lera and her daughters not only heard the Gospel, but also saw it in action.

And not only did parents see the witness of the believers, but also the children, and that had great impact on the parents. I loved to read the testimony of one young boy that attended.

"My name is Yura and I am 8 years old. I live with my mom and two older sisters; our dad left us.

My sister Angelina, who is 17, was invited by a classmate to a youth group in the church. She went and really liked it there. Angelina told me that the church has a Sunday school for children, and that there would also be a Christian camp. I was also invited. But our mom didn't like it. She also did not let Angelina go to the church at first. Then my mother decided to go to church and see herself. She went there, she saw it with her own eyes and after considering, she let me go to the camp. I really liked being in the camp. And I like Sunday school, too. I learned that God loves everyone, and also that Jesus is the best friend!"

This is wonderful account of what God is doing through your prayers and support, as well as the tireless labors of the churches we serve across Russia and her neighboring countries! As followers of Christ, we are to show the world what God is like, that our words and lives testify to the fullness of His majesty and grace in Jesus Christ. May we too be so transformed by Christ that we stand out in our world as a beautiful witness for all to see, even when society around us seeks to compromise the message. As the Apostle Paul admonished us, we are "ambassadors for Christ, as though were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20).

Please continue to pray for the children and these families, that they would be drawn to saving faith in the Lord. Also pray for those who have come to faith, that they would be strengthened daily as new disciples of Christ. •

Christ's Compassion at Work in Russia's Far East

Your Gifts and Prayers Make a Difference for Young Mothers in Crisis

SGA's Orphans Reborn Team in Far East Russia

We greet you in the love of the Lord! Our work with mothers in crisis in the large Khabarovsk region continues and is starting to pick up steam.

At present, we have a young mother and her daughter living in our Crisis Center. She came to us in a rather severe physical and emotional condition. She grew up in an orphanage. Now her condition has improved, and her child's development has improved too. She had come to us with problems with her documents, which are necessary for life in Russia. Those issues are being addressed, and she will probably live independently soon. She came to us by referral from the city's Social Support Center. Of course, we shall not leave her and shall help her in every way possible.

We are planning to take in **one more family before this month is out.** A mother with her baby is leaving a rehab center very soon, and she has no place to go. **City agencies are also referring her to us.** They have a whole list of mothers who need help, but they approach it selectively, based on the degree of hardship experienced by such mothers.

Growth to Help More in Jesus' Name

Some time ago we changed our apartment to a three-bedroom apartment, and now we can take in more than one family. We are also planning to add more space for three or four families. Right now, we can take in two. The apartment is being transformed—people helped us and bought us some home appliances, beds, blankets, pillows, closets, changing tables, and they continue to provide their help to us.

The city is slowly beginning to trust us, and we want to provide even more care for those in need. The number of volunteers is growing, and more than once we have quickly collected food and clothes for people in need. We have distributed available kits for pregnant women and continue to provide targeted support to families that are in difficult life situations. Recently, some families who lost everything in a fire asked us for help, and we collected some clothes and food for them. We are planning to visit other Human Services offices in the villages and nearby settlements, since there are many people in need there.

Recently we registered our ministry, *Far East Without Orphans*, as a Non-Governmental Organization. Right now, we're doing different paperwork and are doing everything to meet all the technical requirements. A registered organization gives you greater opportunities to reach those in need. As always, our desire is to spread the Gospel, to give people hope, and to see lives changed. We thank you for your support, for without it we wouldn't be able to reach those in need.

We thank God for you, for we are sure that He will reward you for your sacrificial and open hearts—following the example set by our Lord Jesus Christ! •

CIS IN THE NEWS

Virtual Conference Held Between Presidents Biden and Putin

Late in November, U.S. president Joe Biden and Russian president Vladimir Putin held a video conference to discuss rising tensions over Ukraine. In the preceding months, Western nations and Ukrainian officials said that Russian troops were massing on the Ukrainian border. According to Radio Free Europe, Russia countered by charging NATO with bolstering its military capabilities near Russia's borders and "making dangerous attempts to conquer Ukrainian territory." In the conference, Mr. Biden warned Mr. Putin that Russia would be hit with "strong economic and other measures" in the event of an offensive against Ukraine, while

Mr. Putin said that Ukraine joining NATO was a "red line" for Russia. Further talks are expected down the road.

Times of heightened tensions and conflict between former Soviet nations and the West are always a deep concern, not only because of the potential human toll, but also due to impacts on the churches we serve as they seek to carry out their ministries and share the hope of the Gospel. Pray with us for a de-escalation of these tensions, for peace to come in the conflict zones, and for the protection of our brothers and sisters as they minister the love of Christ. •


